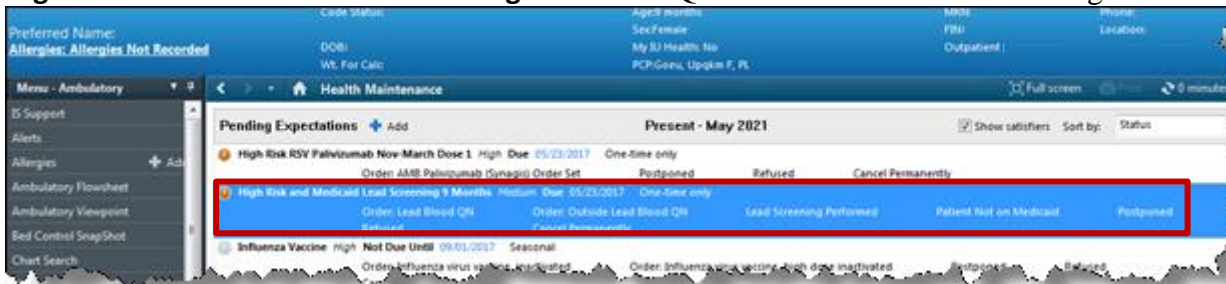

**Overview:** Because almost all U.S. children are at risk for lead poisoning, the CDC recommends High Risk Children and those on Medicaid receive Blood Lead Screening tests at 9 months, 12 months, and 24 months of age.

Three new expectations built into Health Maintenance to meet CDC requirements:

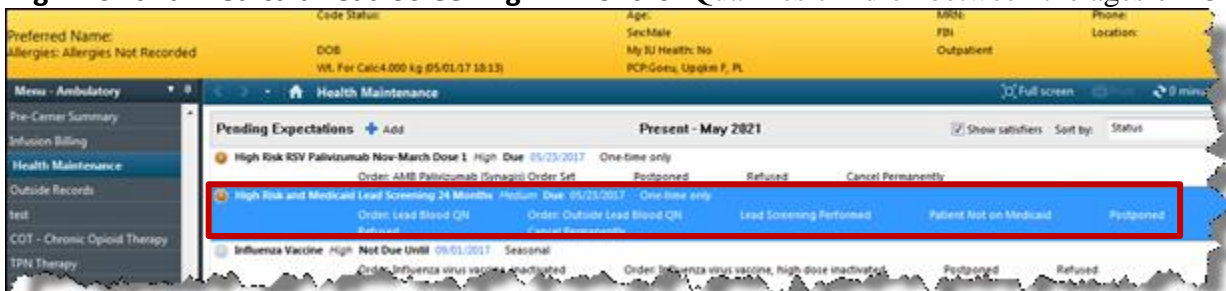
- **High Risk and Medicaid Lead Screening 9 Months-** Qualifies children between the ages of 8-10 months



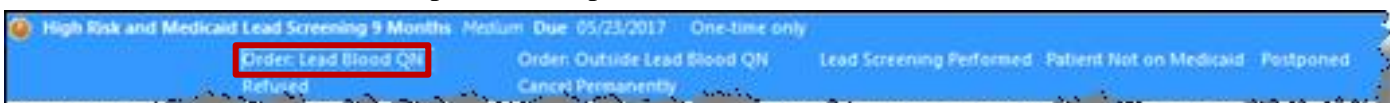
- **High Risk and Medicaid Lead Screening 12 Months-** Qualifies children between the ages of 11-13 months



- **High Risk and Medicaid Lead Screening 24 Months-** Qualifies children between the ages of 23-25 months



Click the **Order** button within the Expectation to place an order for Lead Blood QN or Outside Lead Blood QN.

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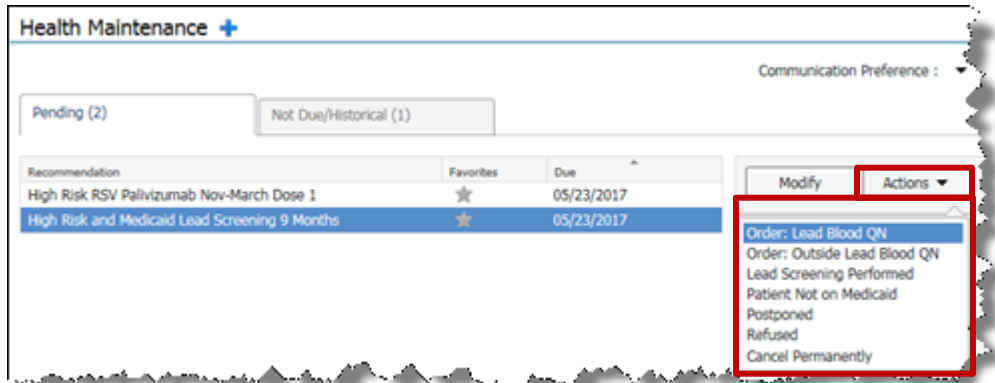
## Updates to High-Risk and Medicaid Lead Screening, continued

Providers may also document the following:

- **Lead Screening Performed Elsewhere**
- **Patient Not on Medicaid**
- **Manually Postpone the Expectation**
- **Mark Patient Refusal**
- **Cancel the Expectation**

### Examples of the Health Maintenance Component on Workflow:

Using the **Actions** dropdown, the **Lead Blood QN** or **Outside Lead Blood QN** order may be placed.



Provider can also document **Lead Screening Performed Elsewhere**, **Patient Not on Medicaid**, **Manually Postpone the Expectation**, **Mark Patient Refusal**, or **Cancel the Expectation**.
